I would like to update everyone on the projects we've have been working on to improve the Balboa Tennis Club.

**Backboard** - Jerry Bischoff and I met with the San Diego Park and Recreation Department and they have approved us moving forward with the

building of a new backboard. They are making a few suggestions and recommendations to our plan. Budget of \$80,000

*Lower Court Lighting* - Lighting for the six lower courts will cost \$92,000.

*Fencing* - Park and Rec. has given us a verbal approval to install fencing around the club so that it can be locked up. Cost \$39,800.

NOTE: It is imperative that our members make contributions to these projects. This makes it a lot easier for outside sources to provide the balance of the funding.



## **Court Reservation Policy Review**

Making a court reservation is a privilege that comes with adult and senior memberships at Balboa Tennis Club. It has come to the attention of the club director and the board of directors that some individuals are abusing this privilege. Members are able to make reservations a week in advance and must cancel their reservation if their plans change. When members do not cancel existing reservations as soon as they know their plans have changed, they impact the ability of other members to make a reservation. Many people try to make a reservation and are told the courts are full. Therefore they don't come to the courts and courts sit empty or are given out to someone that has just shown up with no reservation. Please be considerate of other members. Don't make a reservation unless you have a game. Cancel your reservation if something comes up to change your plans as soon as you know. We hope that members will be considerate of others voluntarily and that no further action, such as fines or loss of privileges, will have to be taken. Thank you for your support and cooperation.



I hope all of you are enjoying summer in San Diego. Despite occasional days of elevated humidity, our city is a wonderful place to play tennis. Make sure you drink plenty of fluids while playing, especially if you're competing in one of the tournaments. Our tournament season is in high gear through September, so if you're planning on getting competitive this year, now is the time to sign up.

After the San Diego Metropolitan Tournament concludes, courts 13-16 and the stadium will be resurfaced. This process should take a week, so plan

Effective January 1, 2009, the dues at Balboa Tennis Club will be increased as follows:

*Adult New:* from \$155 to \$200 (18 64 years old) *Adult Renewal:* from \$135 to \$175(18-64 years old)

**Senior New:** from \$105 to \$135 (65 and older) **Senior Renewal:** from \$85 to \$120 (65 and older)

Four - Month Membership: will remain at \$75 (Any Age)

Junior Team Memberships: \$25 (High School) This membership allows a member of a school team to work out with their team and coach during their tennis season. They may not play any other times without paying a day pass fee and may not make reservations.

New Junior Membership \$90 (Proposed) - Benefits: Junior members may make a reservation for court time a week in advance for the hours of 12pm to 4pm and use the clubhouse facilities. Age: Up to 17 years old (Adult memberships start at 18 years old)

As a public, non-profit tennis facility, the Balboa Tennis Club is dealing with increased costs like every other business and family. Continuing escalation of club expenses and wages necessitates a dues increase. Relatively low fees at Balboa are part of the reason we have such a diverse membership. Overall, with the increase, BTC Members will be paying less than \$17 a month to play tennis 365 days a year. The board believes this moderate increase will strike a balance between the need to keep the dues affordable, while insuring this tennis facility will be well run and kept in excellent condition.

# Tennis Tip by Mike Rogers, USPTA

Your head dictates where the ball goes. Lots of times you hit the ball long and can't figure out why. It's not the racquet, the strings or the new tennis outfit. The problem is your racquet face is too open and simply lifts up the ball too high, usually sending it out or in to the net.

A simple correction is to keep vour head fixed and watch the blur of the ball coming off your strings. By doing that, the racquet face stays vertical longer through the hitting zone. Many players look up too soon and the racquet face opens, sending the ball long. The player is anxious to look where the ball lands and this effects where the ball hits in the court.

By watching the pros, you can learn a lot. Notice that the pro's head is down even at the finish of the swing. Wait until you get back to your ready position to see where the ball landed. Top players, like Nadal, Federer and Serena Williams all keep their head down during the swing.

Your head is the second heaviest part of your anatomy; it dictates where the ball will go.


