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# BTC LEAGUE TEAMS CAPTURE TWO NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS





### **Tennis Tips...**

### ...from the pros

#### THE VOLLEY B

Let the volley come to you or go to the volley? Many club players are caught flat- footed while at the net. The volley stroke itself is the easiest stroke in tennis. Why do so many people have trouble with it? Two reasons: anticipation and positioning.

Anticipation: It takes great skill to react quickly to a volley. Meeting the ball in front is critical. Work on reading the ball coming off your opponent's racquet. I believe this skill can be learned. Make sure you have your wrist locked high so that your racquet and your forearm appear to be a V shape. Using a Continental grip with this V shape ready position will give you maximum stability and strength at the point of contact.

<u>Positioning</u>: Now that you have anticipated what type of volley is coming, you need to perfect your positioning. It would be nice to get your weight into the volley, but that's not always possible. If there isn't time to step forward, try to get power from your legs by bending your knees and pushing into the ground. Of course, you're always looking for an easy ball to move forward and crunch.

The worst thing you can do is let the ball get behind you. So get on your toes and strive for a workout up there at the net. Great players are always flexed and ready to move forward to the ball. Don't sit around and wait for the ball to come to you. **GO TO THE BALL!!!**
